

ADDRESS AND QUESTIONS:

Bishop Hutterer: A reading from John: Jesus said, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you. Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained." (John 20:21-23)

A reading from Matthew: Jesus said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age." (Matthew 28:18-20)

Do not neglect the gift that is in you, which was given to you through prophecy with the laying on of hands by the council of elders. Almighty God, who has given you the will to do these things, graciously give you the strength and compassion to perform them.
