Daily Spiritual Examen

The Daily Examen is a technique of prayerful reflection on the events of the day in order to detect God's presence and discern God's direction for us. The Examen is an ancient practice in the Church that can help us see God's hand at work in our whole experience.

This week as the pandemic rages on, we will reflect upon key scriptures of hope from the Old and New Testament as we launch our new November education Playlist: "Hope."

Come, let us pray.

Monday, November 2, 2020

Read Psalm 25:4-7

Show me your ways, Lord, teach me your paths.
⁵ Guide me in your truth and teach me, for you are God my Savior, and my hope is in you all day long.
⁶ Remember, Lord, your great mercy and love, for they are from of old.
⁷ Do not remember the sins of my youth and my rebellious ways;
according to your love remember me, for you, Lord, are good.

Daily Spiritual Examen

Gather together! If able, light a candle as a way of asking for God's light as you look over the day . . . Say a prayer that you all know, such as the Lord's Prayer:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name,

thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever and ever. Amen.

Examen: Share with each other or think to yourself:

Go through your day: what happened this morning?... What happened at lunch time ... and in the afternoon?...

How was the evening meal? . . .

What else do you remember r about today? ...

What was good about today?...

What was difficult about the day? . . .

What are you finding hard about having to stay inside at the moment? Or what is difficult about needing to go out?

Where did you see God in your day?

Ask God for what you need for tomorrow . . .

Pray for anyone who might be feeling lonely or sick at this time . . .

Thank God for this day . . .

Closing: "Glory be to the Father, and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning, is now and ever shall be, world without end. Amen."

Tuesday, November 3, 2020

Read Psalm 31:21-24

Praise be to the Lord, for he showed me the wonders of his love when I was in a city under siege.
²² In my alarm I said, "I am cut off from your sight!"
Yet you heard my cry for mercy when I called to you for help.
²³ Love the Lord, all his faithful people! The Lord preserves those who are true to him, but the proud he pays back in full.
²⁴ Be strong and take heart, all you who hope in the Lord.

Daily Spiritual Examen

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Wednesday, November 4, 2020

Read Isaiah 40:25-31

"To whom will you compare me? Or who is my equal?" says the Holy One. ²⁶ Lift up your eyes and look to the heavens: Who created all these? He who brings out the starry host one by one and calls forth each of them by name. Because of his great power and mighty strength, not one of them is missing. ²⁷ Why do you complain, Jacob? Why do you say, Israel, "My way is hidden from the Lord; my cause is disregarded by my God"? ²⁸ Do you not know? Have you not heard? The Lord is the everlasting God, the Creator of the ends of the earth. He will not grow tired or weary, and his understanding no one can fathom. ²⁹ He gives strength to the weary and increases the power of the weak. ³⁰ Even youths grow tired and weary, and young men stumble and fall;

³¹ but those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength.
They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not be faint.

Daily Spiritual Examen

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Where did you see God in your day?

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Thursday, November 5, 2020

Read Romans 12:9-13

⁹ Love must be sincere. Hate what is evil; cling to what is good. ¹⁰ Be devoted to one another in love. Honor one another above yourselves.¹¹ Never be lacking in zeal, but keep your spiritual fervor, serving the Lord.¹² Be joyful in hope, patient in affliction, faithful in prayer. ¹³ Share with the Lord's people who are in need. Practice hospitality.

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Friday, November 6, 2020

Read Romans 15:5-13

⁵ May the God who gives endurance and encouragement give you the same attitude of mind toward each other that Christ Jesus had, ⁶ so that with one mind and one voice you may glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ.

⁷ Accept one another, then, just as Christ accepted you, in order to bring praise to God. ⁸ For I tell you that Christ has become a servant of the Jews on behalf of God's truth, so that the promises made to the patriarchs might be confirmed ⁹ and, moreover, that the Gentiles might glorify God for his mercy. As it is written:

"Therefore I will praise you among the Gentiles;

I will sing the praises of your name."

¹⁰ Again, it says,

"Rejoice, you Gentiles, with his people."

¹¹ And again,

"Praise the Lord, all you Gentiles;

let all the peoples extol him."

¹² And again, Isaiah says,

"The Root of Jesse will spring up,

one who will arise to rule over the nations;

in him the Gentiles will hope."

¹³ May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit.

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Saturday, November 7, 2020

Read Matthew 12:18-21

"Here is my servant whom I have chosen, the one I love, in whom I delight;
I will put my Spirit on him, and he will proclaim justice to the nations.
¹⁹ He will not quarrel or cry out; no one will hear his voice in the streets.
²⁰ A bruised reed he will not break, and a smoldering wick he will not snuff out, till he has brought justice through to victory.
²¹ In his name the nations will put their hope."

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
